
4-H Enrollment is currently OPEN!

QUALITY ASSURANCE

Quality Assurance 2023 Dates

All youth enrolled in a market or dairy project must attend one of the following or a club QA training.



All <u>market and lactating dairy</u> project members must complete Quality Assurance training each year. There are two county training dates.

Quality Assurance dates are:

April 15 - Fairgrounds @ 9:00 a.m. May 7 - Fairgrounds @ 1:00 p.m.

Each training will last 1 hour. Parents are encouraged to attend, but not required.

EQUI-STEP

All 4-H members enrolled in a horse project must complete EquiSTEP training. This is a new requirement by Ohio 4-H to ensure our members and their project helpers are safe during workouts and shows.

The 4-H member AND a parent/guardian are required to attend ONE of these trainings.


EquiSTEP dates are:
