Hardin County Jr. Fair entries are due July 31.

All 4-H project (livestock and life skills) that are planning to show or display at the fair must be entered ONLINE by this deadline.

Showmanship MUST be entered online for 2023. There will NOT be a day of sign up.

Enter now at enter.hardincountyfair.org. As a 4-H member, you will go to the above website and then sign into your 4HOnline account to enter. This website also has a click-by-click tutorial video that shows you how to sign in and enter.



Hardin County 4-H Camp still has a handful of spots for boys and girls!


You can still register for camp until July 7th.
