DRUG USE NOTIFICATION FORMS

All market projects and lactating dairy projects must fill out a drug use notification form (DUNF) for the Ohio Department of Agriculture. It is the law!

All species EXCEPT market poultry and hogs can complete their forms by Sunday at http://go.osu.edu/dunf. Hogs and market poultry must fill it out AFTER being tagged on Monday.

SHEEP & GOAT SCRAPIE ID FORM

Sheep and Goat exhibitors must turn in a Scrapie Identification form on Monday during weigh-in. This form must include all sheep and goats brought to the fair, including breeding and market animals.

Those only bringing breeding animals must still present their form at the scales during weigh-in. This is in compliance with ODA's requirements and Ohio Revised Code. The form was emailed to you last Monday. Hard copies of the form will be hanging by the wool display in the sheep and goat barn.



The Seven Steps to a Great Thank-You Note

Why should you write a thank-you note?

- To show appreciation for someone supporting you
- » To acknowledge a gift, donation or service
- To provide recognition to someone who has done a good deed

When should you write a thank-you note?

- » After receiving any type of gift
- » After attending a job interview
- After someone donates to a cause in your name
- After someone goes above and beyond the expected
- After someone writes a letter of recommendation for you
- » After someone helps you with a project or endeavor
- If you want to make a good impression
- If you are unsure of whether or not to write a thank-you note (Write one!)



How should you write a thank-you note?

A good thank-you note has seven main components:



- A greeting to the thank-you note recipient (Dear . . .)
- The specific reason you are thanking them (Mention what they bought, gave or did. This is always important to do first.)
- The reason why you appreciate them (They supported you, were thoughtful and gave a gift, went out of their way to help you out or other reasons.)
- How you plan to use the gift or why the gift or act of service was important to you (You will use it to save for college; you really enjoy playing the game; you can't wait to go shopping with the gift card; you know you have a great chance at the scholarship because of the letter of recommendation or other ways.)
- A comment or detail about yourself, an update on your life or a positive comment (This is a great time to share news on your life or to add a positive remark about the recipient.)
- A repeat of your thank-you (You may leave this out if you sign "with thanks" at your closing.)
- A closing and signature of your name (With thanks, Name or Sincerely, Name)
